Language Arts

This week, we will begin a new unit on the farm. We will learn that a farm is an area of land, and its buildings are used for growing crops and raising animals. We'll talk about what it is to be a farmer and discuss the many types of animals that might be found on a farm. We will discover that each animal is kept on the farm for a specific purpose, whether for food or work. This week, the boys and girls will be introduced to adjectives. We will discuss what adjectives are and how to identify them. We will continue to work on contractions and concentrate on will contractions; this includes — I'll, he'll, she'll, you'll, we'll, they'll, and it'll.

Math / Science

The children will wrap up our unit on how to tell time this week. We will focus on telling time to the minute and reviewing what we have learned over the last few weeks. In Science, we will learn about the farm-to-table process. We will look at what happens with our food at the farm and what it takes to end up on our dinner table at home.
