

Language Arts: A fun new unit on mammals begins this week. The boys and girls will learn how to distinguish mammals from other types of animals. We will learn that mammals have fur or hair, are warm blooded and drink milk from their mothers. We will also talk about reptiles, amphibians, and their habitats. We will also play mammal stomp and sleeping bear. Everyone will get the chance to tell about their favorite zoo animal.

Concept: This week we will start our theme of mammals. We'll discuss different mammals and give facts about them such as where they live and what they eat.
